

A Week of Holy Reflections

Sunday: Triumphal Entry on Palm Sunday. Jesus' triumphal entry is recorded in Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44, and John 12:12-19.

Monday: Jesus Clears the Temple. Monday's events are recorded in Matthew 21:12–22, Mark 11:15–19, Luke 19:45-48, and John 2:13-17.

Tuesday: Jesus Goes to the Mount of Olives. The tumultuous events of Tuesday are recorded in Matthew 21:23–24:51, Mark 11:20–13:37, Luke 20:1–21:36, and John 12:20–38.



Wednesday: Holy Wednesday. The Bible doesn't say what the Lord did on the Wednesday of Passion Week. Scholars speculate that after two exhausting days in Jerusalem, Jesus and his disciples spent this day resting in Bethany in anticipation of Passover.



Thursday: Passover and Last Supper on Maundy Thursday. Thursday's events are recorded in Matthew 26:17–75, Mark 14:12-72, Luke 22:7-62, and John 13:1-38.

Friday: Trial, Crucifixion, Death, and Burial on Good Friday. Friday's events are recorded in Matthew 27:1-62, Mark 15:1-47, Luke 22:63-23:56, and John 18:28-19:37.


Saturday: Saturday in the Tomb. Saturday's events are recorded in Matthew 27:62-66, Mark 16:1, Luke 23:56, and John 19:40.

Easter Sunday: Risen! Sunday's events are recorded in Matthew 28:1-13, Mark 16:1-14, Luke 24:1-49, and John 20:1

Resurrection Rolls With Biscuits

This will make 1 empty tomb roll for each biscuit in the can.

- 1 can of biscuit dough (Big flaky biscuits work really well! You need some you will be able to peel open.)
- 3 Tbs of Butter
- Small bowl of Cinnamon/Sugar Mixture (3 Tbs sugar + 1 Tbs cinnamon)
- 8 Large Marshmallows

Also Needed: parchment paper, Toothpicks

Be sure to preheat your oven to the temperature that your can of biscuits says. Then cover a cookie sheet with parchment paper. This is important because melted marshmallow makes a mess!

Make one small dish of melted butter, and one small dish of your cinnamon sugar mixture. Put your marshmallow on a toothpick. Roll it first in the melted butter, then in your cinnamon sugar mixture

Take 1 biscuit and peel it apart as close to the middle as you can. Peel the biscuit apart, and insert your cinnamon sugar covered marshmallow.

Close the biscuit around the marshmallow and pinch the dough shut all the way around. Space these out on your parchment paper covered cookie sheet, and bake according to the directions on the can until golden brown.
